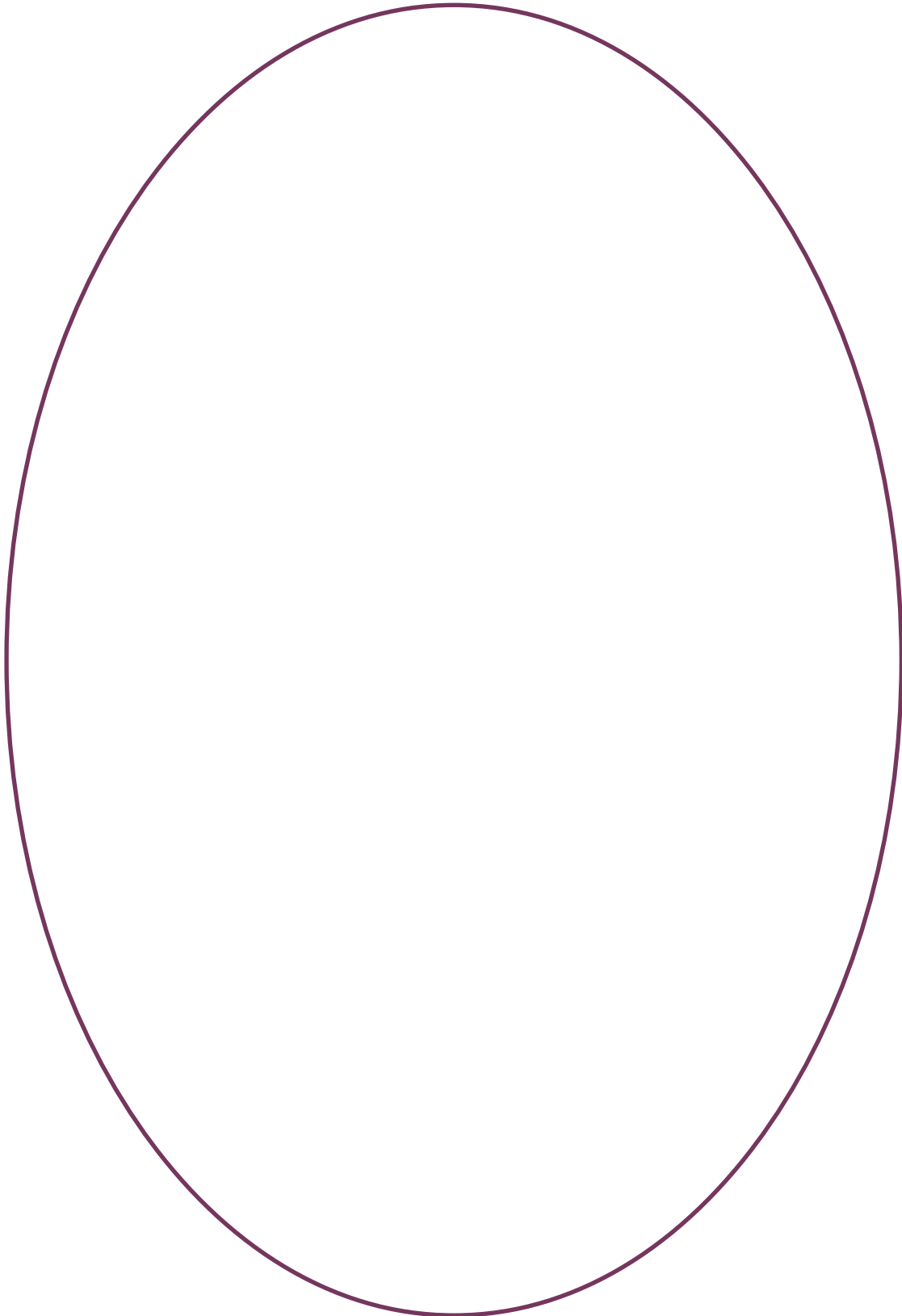
Reflections and Patterns

Gauging Talk Oval

Place your students' names around the oval to reflect their positions. This chart has two options for use.

Option 1: Make a tally mark next to each child's name to gauge the frequency of their participation.

Option 2: Jot down snippets of what each child says as the conversation unfolds.
