


# A Comprehensive Approach to Literacy: Checklist for K-12 Educators

Evaluating the comprehensiveness of your literacy program helps ensure that all students receive effective instruction in reading and writing.

Use this checklist to audit your existing literacy program for the essential components to develop proficient readers and writers. You may identify strengths, uncover potential gaps, and determine where instruction may be over-indexed.

Provide opportunities for sound blending, segmentation, and substitution		
Include rhyming and syllabication exercises		
Use manipulatives (like letter tiles) to reinforce phoneme recognition		
Monitor student progress in recognizing and manipulating sounds		

### Phonics Phonics

Deliver explicit instruction on letter-sound relationships		
Introduce word families and spelling patterns		
Use decodable texts aligned with students' phonics levels		
Practice blending and segmenting regularly		

### Fluency

Schedule repeated readings of familiar texts		
Support oral reading review and feedback sessions		
Use choral and echo reading to build expression		
Track fluency improvements over time		

#### Vocabulary

Incorporate morphological analysis (prefixes, roots, suffixes)		
Provide explicit instruction on academic and content-specific vocabulary		
Encourage wide reading across genres and subjects		

#### Comprehension

Model think-aloud strategies during reading		
Use graphic organizers to support understanding		
Facilitate text-based discussions and questioning		
Scaffold comprehension with feedback and modeling		

#### Knowledge Building

Design thematic units that integrate literacy with other subjects		
Promote wide reading on focused topics		
Use multimedia resources to support content learning		
Connect new information to students' prior knowledge		

## Writing

Assign writing tasks in response to reading		
Teach sentence construction and varied sentence types		
Include revision and editing in the writing process		
Explore multiple genres (narrative, persuasive, informational)		

#### **Assessment**

Use diagnostic tools to identify learning gaps		
Encourage student self-assessment and goal setting		
Adjust instruction based on assessment data

Attend workshops and seminars on literacy instruction		
Engage in coaching or mentoring opportunities
