

## **WONDERS GRADE K**

Wonders Phonics and Phonemic Awareness Focus	Moonlit Mountain Readers Alignment
The <b>Start Smart</b> unit focuses on print concepts, sentence segmentation, rhyme, syllables, plus letter recognition A–Z (no code yet).	It is recommended to hold decodables until Unit 1 because Moonlit Mountain begins with VC/CVC decoding, and the Start Smart unit is predecoding.
Unit 1 focuses on PA segmentation/blending, first sound-spellings /m/, short a, then /s/ in CVC.	<b>Set A, Series 1 (CVC Words)</b> provides dense VC/CVC with <b>m, s, a</b> , along with the early short-vowel set for immediate connected-text application.
<b>Unit 2</b> focuses on continued PA, adds <b>/p/</b> and <b>/t/</b> , along with CVC families.	Set A, Series 1 (CVC Words) continues to be the best match because it keeps practice tight on p/t with short-vowel CVCs before adding complexity.
Unit 3 focuses on alliteration/identity/blending, /k/ spelled c, with long-i awareness only.	Set A, Series 1 (CVC Words) offers CVC practice with c→/k/ to stabilize base code while long-vowel awareness is introduced but not yet used for decoding.
Unit 4 focuses on onset–rime, isolation/blending, short o, h, and short e, f, r (CVC).	Set A, Series 3 (CVC Review) helps reinforce broad CVC with newly taught consonants/vowels. Set A, Series 1-2 may also be a match for authentic practice opportunities.
Unit 5 focuses on syllables + CVC, short <b>e</b> (initial/medial), <b>h</b> , later <b>f</b> and <b>r</b> and there is optional long- <b>e</b> awareness.	Set A, Series 3 (CVC Review) provides concentrated short-vowel CVC across a widened consonant set, keeping long-vowel items out of decodable practice here.
Unit 6 focuses on b, l (including ll), k/ck, l-blends (bl, cl, fl, gl, sl), and – ack.	Set A, Series 4 (Blends) introduces initial blends and then final blends, while retaining closed-syllable CVC control (ck already in-set).
Unit 7 focuses on short <b>u</b> , <b>g</b> and <b>w</b> , later <b>v</b> , final <b>x</b> , plus long- <b>u</b> awareness.	Set A, Series 2 (CVC Words) broadens the consonant inventory (including g, w, v, x) within secure CVC to lift accuracy/automaticity before advanced patterns practice.



Unit 8 focuses on j, qu (/kw/), y, and z, r-blends (br, cr, dr, fr, tr), –ng, along with optional long-o awareness.	Set A, Series 4 (Blends) is a good match for r-blends + final blends, while Set A, Series 5 (Digraphs) is a good match for -ng (and other common digraphs).
<b>Unit 9</b> focuses on systematic <b>CVCe long vowels: a_e</b> , <b>i_e</b> , <b>o_e</b> , along with extension opportunities with digraphs like <i>sh</i> and <i>ch</i> .	Set B, Series 2 (Silent E) progresses across $a_e \rightarrow i_e \rightarrow o_e \rightarrow u_e$ , with cumulative decodables to stabilize the VCe pattern in connected text.
Unit 10 focuses on long u (u_e), then long e (e/ee/e_e). There is also cumulative long-vowel review and work with final blends (st, nd, nk).	<ul> <li>Set B, Series 2 (Silent E) for u_e/e_e practice in connected text</li> <li>Set B, Series 5 (Vowel Teams) for ee/ea=/ē/ reinforcement</li> <li>Set A, Series 4 (Blends) to refresh final blends (e.g., -st, -nd, -nk) within decodable sentences</li> </ul>

### **WONDERS GRADE 1**

Wonders Phonics and Phonemic Awareness Focus	Moonlit Mountain Readers Alignment
The <b>Start Smart</b> unit focuses on rapid review of consonant and short-vowel sound-spellings across three weeks (e.g., m, s, a, p, t, n, r, i / then c, f, o, d, h, e, b, l / then k/ck, u, g, w, x, v, qu, j, y, z), paired with daily PA routines (blend / segment / manipulate).	Set A, Series 1–3 (CVC Words) work for connected-text practice immediately after the letter-sound tune-up. These series concentrate on VC/CVC with all basic consonants and short vowels, matching Start Smart's goal of consolidating letter-sound mastery into blending and word reading.
<b>Unit 1</b> focuses on short vowels in CVC (weeks include short /i/ among other short-vowel review) and early blends; handwriting and automaticity routines support daily decoding.	Set A, Series 1–3 (CVC Words) are good matches for sustained short-vowel decoding practice, and Set A, Series 4 (Blends) is a fit once l-/r-/s-blends are introduced. This keeps texts focused on short-vowel CVCs before practicing initial/final blends (mirroring Wonders' early blend work while holding vowel complexity constant).
Unit 2 focuses on consonant digraphs (sh, th, ng) plus ch, -tch, wh, ph, along with continued work with short-vowel words and blending.	Set A, Series 5 (Digraphs) is a skill match that systematically introduces and then layers ch, th (both), sh, wh, ng, n(k) across a run of decodables. Wonders' week-by-week digraph rollout is mirrored in Series 5, which keeps vowels mostly short and contexts decodable while students internalize each digraph across sentences and short stories.





Unit 3 focuses on long a (a, ai, ay) and VCe patterns (o_e, u_e, e_e), plus soft c/g and -dge, and structural work with simple inflections often appears.	Set B, Series 2 (Silent E) works for robust VCe decoding across all five vowels, and Set B, Series 5 (Vowel Teams) is a match for ai/ay long-a teams. Series 2 provides the cleanest path for automatic VCe mapping (a_e, i_e, o_e, u_e, e_e), while Series 5 supplies connected-text practice with ai/ay, letting you contrast long-a spellings within and across stories.
Unit 4 focuses on long-vowel teams—long e (e, ee, ea, ie), long o (o, oa, ow, oe), long i (i, igh, y). Work with open-syllable (CV) reading also appears in this unit.	<ul> <li>Set A, Series 6 (CV Words) reinforces open-syllable fluency inside connected text while vowel teams are consolidating.</li> <li>Set B, Series 5 (Vowel Teams) is a fit for ee/ea/ie, oa/ow/oe, igh/y because it clusters the vowel team patterns Wonders spotlights (ee, ea, oa, ow, ai/ay, igh).</li> </ul>
Unit 5 focuses on r-controlled vowels (ar, or/ore/oar; er/ir/ur) and diphthongs ou/ow, oi/oy. The phonemic awareness in this unit emphasizes contrastive listening and segmentation with these complex rimes.	<ul> <li>Set B, Series 5 (Vowel Teams) let you spiral in the ou/ow and oi/oy contrasts with lots of opportunities to read and reread in context.</li> <li>Set B, Series 6 (R-Controlled Vowels) is a match for ar, or, er/ir/ur because it isolates the r-controlled set in connected text (minimizing vowel team interference).</li> </ul>
Unit 6 focuses on long-u variants (ue, ew, ui, u) and special vowels/digraphs (au, aw, augh, al), silent-letter clusters (wr, kn, gn) and extension to r-controlled air/are/ear. (These patterns are presented as advanced vowel spellings/special cases in the unit.)	<ul> <li>Set B, Series 6 (R-Controlled) can be used as you introduce/contrast air/are/ear alongside the core r-controlled set</li> <li>Set B, Series 7 (Special Vowels) is a match for ue/ew/ui and au/aw/augh/al families—it is designed for "special vowel" patterns beyond the main team set (it explicitly includes ew/ue and au/aw families)</li> </ul>

<pre>Unit 1 focuses on short-vowel review; two-letter blends; launch VCe (a_e, i_e); inflectional endings -s/-es, -ed/-ing; closed syllables; early possessives/plurals.</pre>	<ul> <li>Set A, Series 4 keeps decoding in short-vowel frames while students automate 2-letter blends (CCVC/CVCC with short vowels)</li> <li>Set B, Series 2 gives controlled VCe practice (a_e, i_e)</li> </ul>





	<ul> <li>Set B, Series 3 lets you apply suffixes in sentences without adding new vowel complexity (-s/-es/-ed/-ing)</li> <li>Optional support: Use Set A, Series 1–3 for any CVC refresh/practice</li> </ul>
Unit 2 extends VCe (o_e, u_e); soft c/g, consonant digraphs, three-letter blends (scr/spr/str/thr/spl/shr), and compound words/prefixes/suffixes.	<ul> <li>Set A, Series 4 (blends) and Set A, Series 5 (digraphs including sh, th, ch, wh, ng/nk) both provide short-vowel practice with the digraphs/blends Wonders is spotlighting in Unit 2</li> <li>Set B, Series 2 cements the new VCe patterns (o_e, u_e)</li> <li>Set B, Series 6 provides connected text for soft c/g/-dge without over-shifting code</li> </ul>
Unit 3 focuses on a systematic sweep of long-vowel spellings: /ā/ (a, ai, ay, ea, ei, eigh, ey), /ī/ (i, y, igh, ie + open syllables), /ō/ (o, oa, ow, oe), /ē/ (e, ee, ea, ie, y, ey, e_e), /ū/ (u_e, ue, u, ew); integrate VCe, open syllables, and contractions.	<ul> <li>Set A, Series 6 offers fluent CV reads so students recognize long-vowel signaling beyond VCe/teams</li> <li>Set B, Series 2 provides silent e practice (e_e, a_e, i_e, o_e, u_e)</li> <li>Set B, Series 5 includes vowel teams that Wonders works through (ai/ay, ee/ea, oa/ow, igh/ie, etc.)</li> </ul>
<b>Unit 4</b> focuses on <b>silent letters</b> (wr, kn, gn, mb, sc) and deep dives into <b>r-controlled</b> : <b>er/ir/ur</b> ; <b>ar</b> ; <b>or/ore/oar</b> . There is also work with extended patterns ( <b>air/are/ear/ere</b> ; <b>eer/ere/ear</b> ), r-controlled syllables, and plurals.	<ul> <li>Set B, Series 3 supports morphology practice without changing the core vowel focus (to apply plural/tense work while staying in decodable text)</li> <li>Set B, Series 6 is a strong fit for r-controlled decoding in connected passages (ar, or, er/ir/ur)</li> </ul>
Unit 5 focuses on diphthongs ou/ow, oi/oy, final stable syllables (C+le: -el/-al and -tion/-sion), and variant vowels: /ü/ (oo, u_e, ew, ue, ui) and /ô/ (a, aw, au, augh, al, ough). Also, short-vowel digraph spellings ea= /ĕ/, ou= /ŭ/, y= /ĭ/.	<ul> <li>Set B, Series 5 provides straightforward C+le multisyllabic practice</li> <li>Set B, Series 6 helps students flex between common and variant vowel reads inside decodable sentences</li> <li>Set B, Series 7 is built for exactly these "special-vowel" contrasts (such as ou/ow, oi/oy, oo, ew/ue/ui, au/aw)</li> </ul>
Unit 6 is a finishing unit for syllable types and multisyllabic decoding (closed, open, VCe, vowel-team, r-controlled, C+le), with application to 3+ syllable words and cumulative morphology.	You can build a rotating routine (lesson focus → matched MMR text → chain/dictation → timed phrase rereads) that spotlights one syllable type per day while keeping decodable demands perfectly aligned to the skill of the moment. Depending on the focus area, consider:  • Open/CV: Set A, Series 6  • VCe: Set B, Series 2
